

Notes:

Also not included in the time table: 2-Day Rebel Clown Training, and Bike workshops with Bicycology: free bike workshops and basic maintenance, pedal-powered soundsystem, Bicycology Micro-Cinema, creative bike beautification, intro to 12 volt soundsystems, intro to renewable energy, and workshops on bike politics and culture. Glossary of Climate Camp Terms:

Power down: every evening at around 11 (later on Saturdays) the soundsystems will be turned off and everyone will be asked to keep noise levels low, especially around areas where people are sleeping. This allows the camp to be a welcoming place for everyone including children, their parents, and people who want to get up early in the morning! There will be a chill-out area where people who want to stay up late and keep socializing can do so.

Set-up: the practical work of setting up the site, including putting up marquees, building compost toilets, setting up kitchens.

Take down: taking down the structures, cleaning up, recycling, and putting the site back to the state in which we originally found it.

The Climate Camp has no leaders, it's about jointly creating the camp together, so we hope that everyone who comes will help with set-up, take-down, and all the tasks that will be needed to keep the camp running on a day-to-day basis.
